

THE VILLAGE OF CATSKILL:

A WATERFRONT-AND-CENTER EXPERIENCE

The Hudson River has always played an important role in Catskill. When the artist Thomas Cole first traveled up the river by steamboat in 1825 to the landing at the end of Main Street (where the Historic Catskill Point and Frank Guido's Port of Call Restaurant sit today), he fell in love with this picturesque village that is surrounded by water on three sides. In the years that followed, artists from around the world were drawn to Catskill's sweeping views and painted some of the world's most famous landscapes.

Today, the peaceful and artsy Village of Catskill welcomes you with a well-preserved 19th-century Main Street filled with shops and galleries, waterfront restaurants, river activities including fishing and boating, a nature preserve with Bald Eagles, and a National Historic Site where American art began.

Visit Catskill, a classic Hudson River town, and experience the Hudson River itself.



HUDSON RIVER SCHOOL

Start at the Thomas Cole National Historic Site, birthplace of America's first art movement, the Hudson River School. Watch the film, take the tour, and get the history that will inform the rest of your day.

HUDSON RIVER SKYWALK

One of only two pedestrian crossings over the Hudson River for hundreds of miles, the Rip Van Winkle Bridge provides panoramic views from hundreds of feet in the air. Use the parking lot that is marked "For use of the facilities only," just east of the toll booths.

HUDSON RIVER BOATING

Rent a canoe or kayak for the afternoon from Riverview Marine and get onto the great river itself. Paddle into the Audubon Sanctuary and check out the Bald Eagles.
